This year's group includes 8 head coaches and 10 assistant coaches. In an effort to increase interest in working and coaching in the sport of volleyball, the committee recognized 7 graduate assistants and operations personnel in this year's watchlist. "In the last five years volleyball has grown in interest and support. This increase leads to more opportunities for participation and employment.
